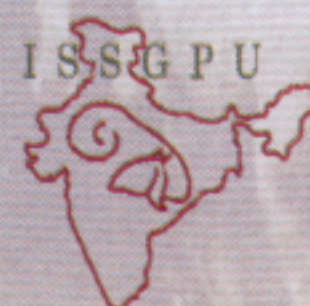

Animal husbandry is a major economic activity of rural people, especially in the arid and semi arid regions of Rajasthan. Nearly 1.2 million people are involved in sheep rearing; further 1.2 million are involved in activities related to wool processing and value addition. The districts Barmer, Bikaner, Churu, Ganganagar, Hanumangarh, Jaisalmer, Jalore, Jhunjhunu, Jodhpur, Nagaur, Pali and Sikar comprises of hot arid region, which harbor nearly 75% sheep and 54% of goat population. Selling of lambs at an early age for quick income has discouraged sheep farmers from raising animals for wool. Sixty percent of the wool produced in India is of carpet grade, but it is insufficient to meet the demands of carpet industry. Indian carpets are in great demand all over the world due to their quality. Presently, India fulfills 20% of global consumption of woolen hand knotted carpets. During the last decade, 90-95% of the hand knotted carpets manufactured in India have been exported. However, India is importing substantial quantities of carpet wool. To meet the targets of increased manufacture of carpets for export and domestic consumption, sincere efforts are needed to augment production of carpet wool in the country, so as to decrease dependence on wool import. Issues such as: up gradation of low producing sheep population under field conditions; protection and development of pasture ranges to improve production; simple need based grading system; remunerative prices and quality wool production, need to be addressed by producers and stakeholders. This seminar is an effort to bring the wool producers, stakeholders and end users to a common platform and to discuss issues related to the betterment of the Wool sector and problems associated at different levels.
